We are continuing our treasured TBT tradition of providing food for those in need. It's even more critical this year for farm workers and other struggling families.

October 1 - October 11, 2024

Q: Who will be the recipients of the 2023 Food Drive?

- A: 1. **Farm worker families.** Food Share will deliver your donations directly to the farms or other distribution sites.
2. **Brotherhood Food Distribution.** They serve 50 diverse recipients who often must choose between food or rent.
3. **Food Share.** Each \$1 donated provides almost 3 meals. Monetary donations should be mailed to TBT and will be forwarded as a group to Food Share.

Q: What are some of the foods that farm worker families need?

- A: Dried or canned pinto or black beans, canned whole tomatoes, tomato sauce and mixed vegetables, long grain white or brown rice, Masa corn flour, vegetable oil, mayonnaise, angel hair pasta, thin noodles or Ramen noodles.

Q: Do you also want other types of food?

- A: Absolutely! We welcome a variety of nourishing, non-perishable items.
NO GLASS CONTAINERS. All recipients will enjoy canned fruits, vegetables and soups, tuna and chicken, pasta and pasta sauce, low-sugar cereals & breakfast bars, etc. All kids love peanut butter and mac & cheese.

Q: Are you collecting clothing, diapers or other items?

- A: NO, we are only collecting food and checks made out to Food Share. Perhaps we can do another collection later.

Q: Where should we bring our donations?

- A: There will be a convenient area in or adjacent to the TBT parking lot that will be clearly marked. Donations will be transferred into the POD throughout the day.
